

I. Introductory provisions

II. Subject of activity

The club is a voluntary, independent organization founded for herding lovers to help and develop breeding and training of sheepdogs in Slovakia. The club strives for the development of all working dogs, but especially for the development and breeding of the Border Collie breed.

III. Club authorities

1. Chairman
2. Committee
3. Membership meeting

Chairman

1. He is the highest executive representative of the club. Represents the club in communications and negotiations and informs the members about the discovered facts.
2. The maximum one-time disposable value of the chairman is EUR 100. Above a higher amount, the chairman is obliged to request the committee to approve the selection.
3. The chairman is elected by the membership meeting for a period of 1 year.
4. The election of the chairman will take place every year in December of the given calendar year.
5. The Chairman is governed by the laws of the Slovak Republic relating to Foundations, non-profit organizations and associations.

Committee

1. It is the second highest body of the club.
2. The committee has 3 members and is a statutory body and is elected for 1 year.
3. The committee is responsible for the proper operation, property, promotion of the activity and development of the club.
4. The votes of the committee members are equal.

5. The committee must meet at least once a year. Every committee member has the right to call a committee meeting.

Membership meeting

1. A membership meeting is established with a gathering of members. Discusses the activities of the club, discusses and adopts plans for the next periods.

2. Elects club bodies and evaluates the work of the chairman and the committee.

3. Decides on the admission of new members and the amount of the membership fee.

4. The membership meeting is convened by the club committee.

5. The membership meeting is held once a year, but in the case of a request by the majority of members (51%), an extraordinary membership meeting must be held within 30 days. The request must be delivered in writing to the chairman with signatures and the topic for which the special meeting will be elected.

6. Invitations to member meetings must be sent to members at least 30 days before the meeting. Each member has one vote, which has equal weight. The members' meeting is chaired by the chairman or a person authorized by him. Minutes must be taken of the membership meeting.

IV. Membership in the association

A person with a permanent or temporary residence in the Slovak Republic can become a member of SAOP.

Any natural person over the age of 18 can become a member of the association, regardless of gender, religion or political opinion.

Regular members have the right to vote at the membership meeting and use the benefits of the club.

Termination of membership is voluntary and can happen under the following circumstances:

a, the member withdraws from the club upon receipt of a written request,

b, by death,

c, by expelling a member from the club for gross violations of the statute or spreading the bad name of the club,

d, due to non-payment of the membership fee,

e, the demise of the club.

V. Rights and obligations of members

The rights of association members are as follows:

a, get involved in club activities

b, to be interested in the activities of the club

- c, vote and be elected
- d, submit proposals
- e, enjoy the benefits of membership

The duties of the members of the association are as follows:

- a, pay membership fees
- b, to maintain the good name of the club
- c, comply with the statutes
- d, to help the development of the association

VI. Financial management

Funds for the association's activities are obtained from member contributions, donations from Physical person and Legal Entities and income from its activities (trials, seminars). All funds raised must be used for running and financing the club. The funds may not be used for the enrichment of natural or legal persons or for club members.

VII. Qualifications for international races

The qualification of Slovak competitors for the international CSC-Continental Sheepdog Championship and Wordtrial for the Slovak team takes place twice a year by organizing Open Trials. The trial is always judged exclusively by an international referee from abroad.

The two best handlers from both qualifying trials qualify for international races.

VIII. Final Provisions

The club can be dissolved by voluntary dissolution based on the decision of the members' meeting.

and, the dissolution of the club is accepted at the members' meeting by a qualified majority of 2/3 votes in the presence of at least half of the voting members.

b. The members of the club determine the method of liquidation and distribution of the club's assets.
